WHY BRING YOUR STUDENTS?

Doolin Cave - from the Irish word *Pol an Ionain* which means 'Ivy Cliff Cave' - is a limestone cave near Doolin in County Clare, on the western edge of The Burren. The Cave offers a true underground experience: you'll travel 200 feet down into the earth to view a fantasy-like world created from water, time and the hand of nature.

Your students will journey through an intricate system of passages and pathways, leading into the majestic cathedral-like dome of the cave.

The hero of Doolin Cave is EUROPE'S LARGEST STALACTITE, called The Great Stalactite. This incredible 7.3m, 10-tonne structure is living proof of how a single continuous drop of water formed this mighty structure that is the only one of its kind in Ireland.



WHAT EDUCATIONAL THEMES CAN YOU EXPLORE?

GEOLOGY

An area of great geological significance within the Burren Geopark, Doolin Cave is a Geosite.

HISTORY

Learn about the fascinating discovery of the cave in 1952 when explorers J M Dickenson and Brian M Varley noticed a small stream that disappeared under a large, steep cliff.

CONSERVATION

Hear about how Doolin Cave practices sustainable development - meeting today's needs without compromising future generations.

SPECIAL PROTECTION AREA

We are members of the Burren Ecotourism Network which promotes sustainable tourism in the Burren.

NATURE

Over ground, you'll explore one of Europe's most compelling landscapes - the Burren - with its wealth of fauna, rare flora and bird life.

CULTURE

Experience the rich heritage and culture of the area, including traditional farming practices.

ENVIRONMENTALISM

Visit our 1km eco-trail and study our native, indigenous shrubs and trees, planted to retain the biodiversity of the area.

WHAT WILL YOUR STUDENTS EXPERIENCE?

THE UNIQUE STRUCTURES OF THE CAVE

Your group will experience and get up close to the force of nature that is the Great Stalactite.

Measuring 7.3 metres long and weighing around 10 tonnes, this vast structure reaches down from the roof of the Cave, catching the light, reflecting colours and detail like a massive, ornate glass chandelier.

Your tour guide will also share information on the extensive show of other speleothems within the cave. These geological structures form when mineral deposits accumulate over time and are typically found in calcareous caves due to carbonate dissolution reactions. Speleothems at Doolin Cave include Stalagmites, Helicities, Columns, Pillars, Fossils and Bell Formations.

THE NATURAL WORLD OF THE BURREN

As a contrasting above-ground experience, your student group can follow the Doolin Cave Eco Trail - a fascinating 1-km looped path around the cave that showcases the Burren at its best.

You can use the key discovery points enroute to learn about the formation of the landscape and how the 'karst' pavement was moulded and sculpted over time.

Your group can explore the natural wildness of the area, featuring many indigenous woodland plants, meadow wildflowers, Alpine, Arctic and Mediterranean plants as well as trees and local grasses.

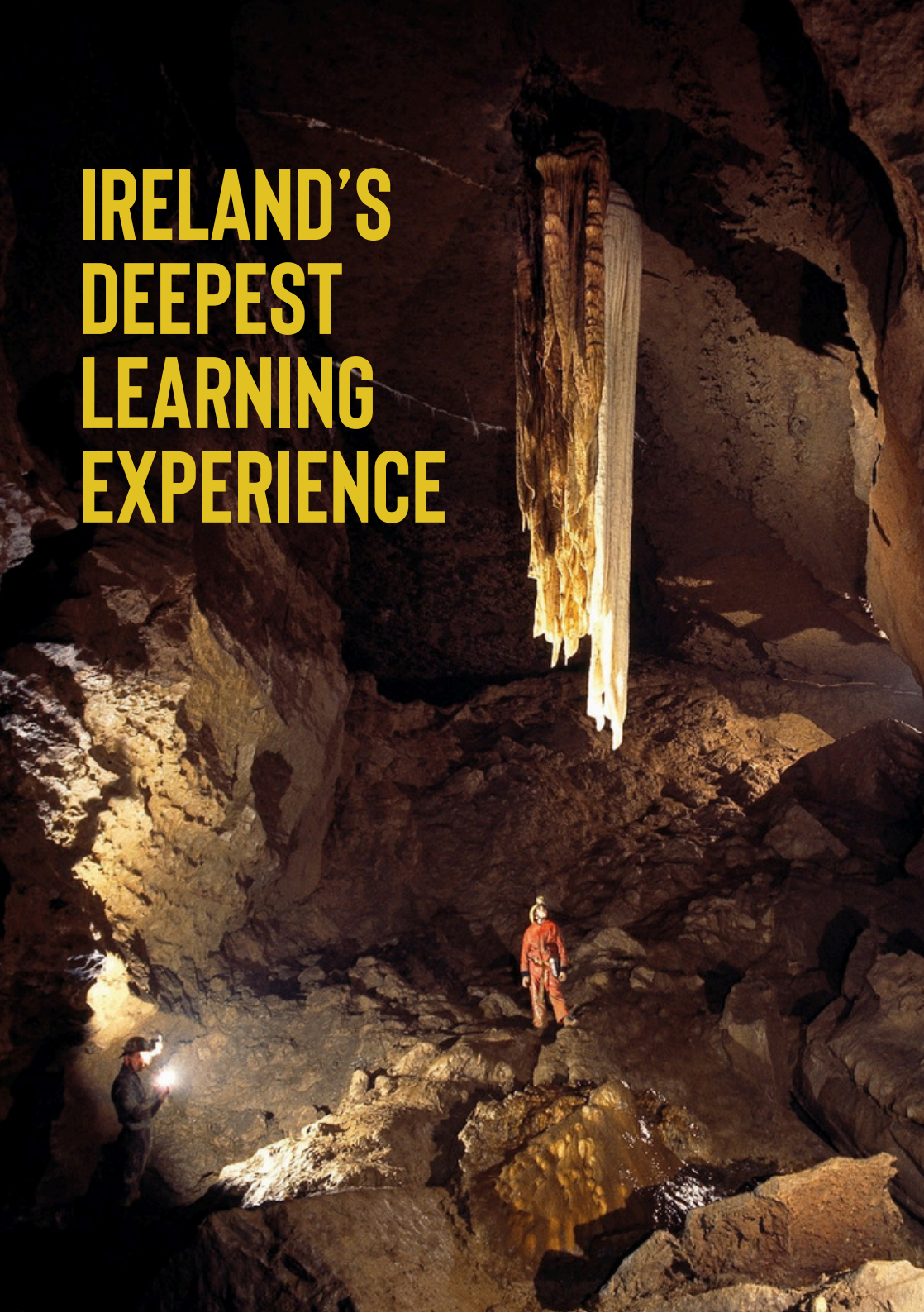
THE ART OF DOOLIN CAVE

See how our unique character has inspired local art in the form of Doolin Cave Pottery. Artist Caireann Browne creates her pottery pieces from glacial clay which has been hand dug 12-ft deep within the caverns of the Cave.

The clay is completely unique, discovered by geologists to contain pollen from pre-Ice Age flowers which are no longer found on Earth. A lesson in art, the pottery designs echo the drip and layering of the Cave's stalactites.

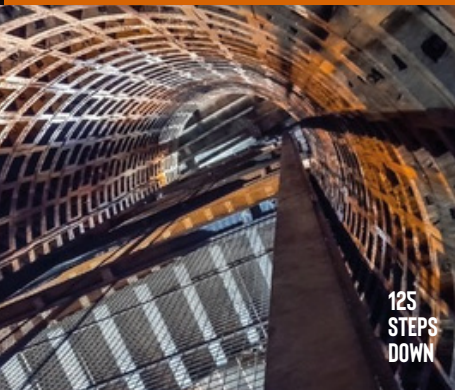
